## Grants to Indian Tribal Governments Program

**Brief Instructions:** This form must be completed for each Grants to Indian Tribal Governments (Tribal Governments Program) grant received. Grant administrators and coordinators are responsible for compiling and submitting a single report that reflects all information collected from grant partners.

If the response is yes, then the grantee must complete that section or subsection. If the response is no, the rest of that section or subsection is skipped.

For example: If you are a victim services agency providing training and victim services with staff funded under this grant, you would complete A1, A2, B, C1, C3, D, and F (and answer 'no' in C2, C4-C7, and E1-E5).

The activities of volunteers or interns should be reported if they were coordinated or supervised by Tribal Governments Program-funded staff or if Tribal Governments Program funds substantially supported their activities.


